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***Opera San José presents powerful double-bill
Pagliacci and La voix humaine***

SAN JOSÉ, CA— **Opera San José** continues its 28th season with a double-bill of two intensely dramatic one-act operas, Leoncavallo's emotional tour de force ***Pagliacci*** paired with Poulenc's French monodrama ***La voix humaine***. Eight performances are scheduled from November 12 through 27 at the California Theatre, 345 South First Street in downtown San José. Tickets are on sale at the Opera San José Box Office, by phone at (408) 437-4450 or online at www.operasj.org. ***Pagliacci*** and ***La voix humaine*** are made possible, in part, by a Cultural Affairs Grant from the City of San José.

Ruggiero Leoncavallo's Italian opera ***Pagliacci*** is a timeless tale of anguish and heartbreak. Canio, the leader of a traveling commedia dell'arte troupe is the clown who must laugh, and make others laugh, while masking his own grief after learning that his wife Nedda has betrayed him with another man. In the end, art meets tragedy in a rage of passion and jealousy. ***Pagliacci*** has one of the most famous arias in all opera, "Vesti la giubba," and has become known as the epitome of verismo. This powerful opera, shocking in its time, set the standard for dramatic realism and remains one of the most performed operas world wide.

La voix humaine, Francis Poulenc's French monodrama, follows a young woman's emotional phone conversation with her lover who is discarding her to marry another woman. The heroine, known simply as *elle* (she) is desperately trying to win back his love. Set in 1950's Paris, this one-act opera paints an emotional portrait of an abandoned woman teetering on the edge during an affecting and engaging monologue. Poulenc composed the opera for French soprano Denise Duval in 1959 from Jean Cocteau's 1932 play for Berthe Bovy, which was later made into a film for Anna Magnani, and it remains one of the few great solo pieces for women today.

Conducting *Pagliacci* and *La voix humaine* is **Bryan Nies**. **Nies** conducted last season's *The Barber of Seville* and served as assistant conductor for the West Coast premiere of Carlson's *Anna Karenina*, conducting two performances. Previously, he conducted Opera San José's *Eugene Onegin*, and shared conducting duties for the company's productions of *Manon*, *La rondine*, *Werther*, *The Barber of Seville* (2006), *The Crucible* and *A Masked Ball*. **Nies** is on faculty at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music and San José State University where he is the director of opera and orchestra, as well as assistant conductor of the Oakland East Bay Symphony and the resident conductor of the Oakland Youth Orchestra.

Cynthia Stokes makes her company debut during the 2011 – 2012 season directing *Pagliacci*. Recent productions directed by **Stokes** include the world premiere of *Sextet*, a new opera by Nicolas Reveles at Diversionary Theatre in San Diego, *Italian Straw Hat* for Amarillo Opera, *Dooley* for Diversionary Theatre, and *Roméo et Juliette* for San Antonio Opera. Other directorial credits include Glimmerglass Opera, San Diego Opera, Opera Company of Philadelphia, Cincinnati Opera, and Opera Carolina.

Former Opera San José resident artist **Layna Chianakas** makes her directorial debut with this production of *La voix humaine*. In addition to Opera San José, she has performed with such opera companies as Cleveland Opera, Nashville Opera, Des Moines Metro Opera, Sarasota Opera, Virginia Opera, Dayton Opera, Festival Opera, Nevada Opera, Opera Santa Barbara, Madison Opera, Sacramento Opera, Intermountain Opera, and the Richard Wagner Bayreuth Festival. **Chianakas** is currently an assistant professor of voice at San José State University's School of Music and Dance.

Pagliacci features current members of Opera San José's resident company in principal roles. Resident tenor **Alexander Boyer** alternates in the role of Canio with guest artist **Travis Jones**. Boyer recently played the title role in Opera San José's company premiere of Mozart's *Idomeneo*. Jones returns to Opera San José having previously performed the role of Lensky in Opera San José's *Eugene Onegin*. Sopranos **Jasmina Halimic** and **Jouvanca Jean-Baptiste** share the role of Nedda, Canio's unfaithful wife. Halimic and Jean-Baptiste have previously shared the role of Mimi in *La bohème* and the title role in David Carlson's *Anna Karenina*. Baritone **Evan Brummel** makes his debut as a resident artist with Opera San José in the role of Tonio, sharing the role with former resident artist **Jason Detwiler**. Alternating in the role of Nedda's lover, Silvio, are baritone **Krassen Karagiozov** and bass-baritone **Isaiah Musik-Ayala**, both resident artists. Resident tenor **Michael Dailey** performs the role of Beppe.

The role of elle in Opera San José's *La voix humaine* will be shared by **Betany Coffland** and **Suzan Hanson**. **Betany Coffland** is in her fourth year as resident artist with Opera San José and recently played the role of Idamante in Opera San José's company premiere of Mozart's *Idomeneo*. Other roles with Opera San José include Dolly in the West Coast premiere of David Carlson's *Anna Karenina*, Rosina in *The Barber of Seville*, Dorabella in *Così fan tutte*, Cherubino in *The Marriage of Figaro*, and the title role in *Carmen*. **Suzan Hanson** returns to Opera San José after having been previously seen as Marie in the company's world premiere performance of Craig Bohmler's *Tale of the Nutcracker*. Recent engagements for **Hanson** include the title role in *Medea* for Long Beach Opera, Eurydice in *Orpheus X* for American Repertory Theater, Brunnhilde (*Siegfried* and *Twilight of the Gods*) and Freia (*Rheingold*) for Long Beach Opera and Pittsburgh Opera Theater, and the Countess (*The Marriage of Figaro*) for Greensboro Opera.

Opera San José's production of *Pagliacci* and *La voix humaine* includes set designs by **J. B. Wilson**, costume designs by **Cathleen Edwards** (*Pagliacci*) and **Alyssa Oania** (*La voix humaine*), lighting design by **David Lee Cuthbert**, and wig and makeup designs by **Jeanna Parham**.
