Beginning with Mozart, the master, we will produce his clever Così fan tutte, spiced with passionate attraction, stolid resistance, and hilarious capitulation in a contest of 18-century seduction. But all is not well that ends well. Così, so honest regarding human nature, is filled with the elegance of Mozart in his piercing maturity. Conducted by Peter Grunberg and directed by Brad Dalton, *Così fan tutte* will delight you and leave you with something to think about.

Puccini created a romance in waltz time so buoyant that one floats in its harmony and melody. It's a romance that doesn't go happily ever after, but the beauty of the affair is worth the ride. We meet a young woman who has lost her taste for society, and returns, just for an evening, to her carefree youth. On her one night out, she falls in love with a young man and has a summer of bliss, more bliss than she could bear. La rondine is a masterpiece that rewards us for taking time to become better acquainted. Conductor Christopher Larkin and stage director Candace Evans will make their Opera San José debuts with this opera.

Wagner is scary, but only because his operas are famously long; however, not all of them are long... The Flying Dutchman was among his first and it is mercifully short! A fascinating character, the Dutchman has been cursed to live until he finds a woman who can truly love him. After 300 years he has about given up, then meets Senta... Conducted by Joseph Marcheso and directed by Brad Dalton, The Flying Dutchman will hold your attention.

We close with Verdi's La traviata. This tragic romance follows a Parisian courtesan through her one chance at happiness, but Death takes charge, leaving behind the one man who ever loved her. La traviata is immortal. Joseph Marcheso will conduct and stage director Shawna Lucey makes her company debut.
